Adelaide Airport records 6.2% growth in International passengers for Q4 FY18

Adelaide Airport Limited (AAL) finished FY18 with continued strong growth in the fourth quarter of the financial year with 6.2% growth in international traffic and 4.3% growth in domestic travel.

Domestic capacity growth of 2.8% coupled with strong overall Seat Load Factors drove the 4.3% increase in domestic travel. New routes and additional capacity in the past 12 months on non-capital mainland markets such as Avalon, Hobart and Kangaroo Island have stimulated domestic growth as well as provided South Australians with more direct flight options within Australia. Regionally, resource routes have added 12.6% capacity with an associated uplift in passengers.

International growth was driven by a 9.0% increase in capacity in the form of Qatar's return to Daily services (up from 5 per week), and Air New Zealand's upgauge from an A320 to a Dreamliner. Further new generation aircraft will be on their way to Adelaide from December when Fiji Airways introduce their brand new B737 Max aircraft to the route.
