First internal works underway.....

The first internal construction works will start in late November as the pace picks up on the Adelaide Airport's domestic and international terminal expansion project - improving our international arrivals and departures experience and creating more retail and dining options for all travellers.



Construction update

- Construction is about to start inside the terminal towards the northern (Virgin Australia/Tigerair) end.
- Hoardings will be in place from late November.
- The Relay store is relocating to make way for building works. A pop-up Relay store will soon open further down the northern concourse.
- Cibo will also be partially impacted but will remain open in its current location.

Current customer impact

- Customers will start to see building works inside the terminal.
- At this stage, impact on terminal operations should remain minimal. Check in and boarding times as recommended by your airline.

Project milestones

- Construction started: August 2018
- Internal works starting November 2018
