## Adelaide Airport records -95.6% traffic decline in Q4

For the full 2019/2020 Financial Year, Adelaide Airport Limited (AAL) saw overall passenger traffic decline by 24.1%, due to the impacts of COVID-19 on travel during the second half of the year.

The fourth quarter saw an overall decline of 95.6% in passenger traffic as a result of continued travel restrictions, both domestically and internationally, which significantly impacted the quarter’s performance.

With only a limited number of international flights operating during the quarter, including repatriation flights and Singapore Airline’s once per week services during the month of June, Adelaide Airport saw minimal international passenger traffic.

Domestic travel declined by 95.0%, driven by decreased travel demand and capacity from the COVID-19 outbreak. Many interstate routes had been suspended and only a limited number of services to the major capital cities, Melbourne, Sydney, Perth and Brisbane, were operated. Regional travel was also heavily impacted with most regular public transport services operating limited schedules.
