New Runway Lights!

Adelaide Airport is one of the 24 accredited Asia-Pacific airports that obtained a Level 3 'Optimisation' under the Airport Carbon Accreditation (ACA), an institutionally endorsed global carbon management program for airports. As part of our efforts to manage and reduce our carbon footprints, we have replaced our existing airfield ground incandescent light fittings on the main runway with more energy-efficient light-emitting diodes (LEDs).

The existing light fittings has been serving Adelaide Airport since 1994. To ensure the safety and serviceability of aircraft operations, we have replaced **106** runway edge lights on the Main Runway during the night of Monday 18 December as part of the Main Runway and Taxiways Overlay Project (MRTOP).

This is a big milestone for Adelaide Airport. There was a lot of planning and coordination involved, with time constraints such as working during the existing night curfew (11pm to 6am) and ensuring no delays to normal flight operations by 6am.

We thank you for your understanding as we undertake these important works to continue improving our facilities.

The next time you're flying out of Adelaide, remember to look out and appreciate our new shiny runway lights!
